Gentlemen:

This is in regard to Interior Secretary Babbitt and USDA Secretary Glickman's "Unified Federal Policy to Ensure a Watershed Approach to Federal and Resource Management".

Federal agencies are attempting to make law a sweeping policy regarding the Nation's water without the authorization of Congress--our duly elected Representatives And Senators. This attempt to by-pass Congress and the President on such an important Issue should not be allowed!

They are attempting to usurp the rights of states to manage their water.

They are attempting an unfunded mandate--which will be very costly to all The people.

They do not even have a clear definition of "clean water or other natural resource Goals" in the document.

The Clean Water Act explicitly exempts non-point source pollution from regulation , And federal agencies have no legal authority to implement TMDLs and BMPs.

This whole proposal should be dropped because it is not authorized by Congress. The states are much better at managing the water than federal agencies.
