 - a. BMPs - no one has done this on an island scale
 - b. Scale makes a big difference. What is cost effective also impacts. Need site specific BMPs.

 1. Unified approach will bring uniform procedures for land managers whereas before each agency worked independently on different water quality assessments on their land
 2. accountability amongst the federal agencies should be built in to this policy which is a holistic approach that gets federal, state, county and managers together to restore water quality

14. Watershed council could work to ensure compliance but this may be limited to voluntary measures.

15. Essential piece of policy is to get federal agencies complying with federal regulations. Primary duty is federal land managers to more expeditiously meet CWA standards for lands wholly within federal jurisdiction. Bring watershed up to CWA stds by federal land managers. I want to see the federal agencies bring these watersheds up to par. National policy so need national accountability. Accountability measures are not in this policy. How is this going to work?

16. Watersheds which are ~~are~~ completely managed by federal agencies because they fall under federal lands. No complications of mixed ownership, so should federal agency go in and restore the waterbody. Should give these watersheds a high priority.

2nd Question: How can restoration on federal lands be best coordinated?

1. Multitude of landowners with deep pockets - look at where there are enough people to pull this off - the time and money, resources come into play.
2. Priority to do assessments first throughout the country even on non-federal lands. Prioritize by watershed.
3. Need explicit language that prioritizes listed species. Develop the protected watershed category that clearly targets resources.
Refine ecological criteria for "special protected watersheds", high priority should be to
⑤ Consistent with species recovery in that watershed

Anti-degradation issue needs to be cleared up.
Make decisions that recognizes ^{that} further degradation on water quality impaired streams can not continue on federal lands.
No clear decision protocol that recognizes that requirement
