

Computer Support Staff Training

Windows server administration:

- DOI recently voiced their plans to move the entire Department to a unified Active Directory (AD) environment. The terminology and concepts involved with AD vary greatly from our existing NT environment. SAs were exposed, some for the first time, to AD training at the recent ITEM2002 but additional training will be needed. Local vendors like Comp USA or Global Knowledge, should be able to thoroughly cover the material and will minimize travel expenses.

Look for instructors that are Microsoft Certified Trainers (MCT) or training centers that are CTEC certified (<http://mcspreferal.microsoft.com/> --select country, then state, then click on "Training" and select "Windows 2002 Server"* from the **Technology** pull down menu). In most cases signing up for a package deal will be the most cost effective route. Individual courses cost ~\$2K, you should seek offers that bundle five courses for ~\$5K.

Sun/Solaris administrators:

- WRD Specific “Solaris” training courses are not offered on a regular basis but can be coordinated and offered at either the biennial ITEM meeting or the Regional Computer Specialist meetings.
- Sun Microsystems offers a variety of courses at various locations through out the US. Average price per course is \$2K. Government or GSA discount may apply, doesn’t hurt to ask. Most system administrators will be able to skip the basic SA course, SA-238.

Linux administrators:

Linux like Solaris are both Unix Operating Systems. They are similar in many ways, but because Linux comes in many flavors (Red Hat, Caldera, Debian, Slackware, etc. <http://www.techtv.com/screensavers/showtell/story/0,24330,2216708,00.html>) you should consider sending the administrator(s) to a course that specifically focuses on the flavor(s) of Linux that your office is running.

Telecommunications:

- It is very important that SAs understand how connectivity from their office to the Internet takes place to troubleshoot network problems.

Desktop administration:

SMS, Intel LANDesk Training (C1239TC), Ghost, and Norton Antivirus are some of the tools that have been identified to assist with Desktop administration. These courses are also offered at NTC on an “as needed” basis.

Ingres database system administrators:

- A course for NWIS DBAs will be held in FY03, more details will be sent out by the NWIS group soon. Since this course is not held on a regular basis, please plan on sending your DBA.

E-mail administrators:

- Local Lotus Mail Administrator course – The first LLMA conference was held in FY02 and plans are in the works to carry out a similar training this fiscal year.

Security

Explicit security courses have not been listed in this document because most system administration courses also address basic network security. It is important for SAs to understand how each 'service' can be secured in their particular operating system and how concepts/ protocols such as firewalls, IPSec, tcp/udp work but diving into more detailed courses on these topics is not a priority at this time.
